Tuesday, October 17, 2023 6:00 pm **Dr. JOHN T. LOWE, Jr.** is a native of Lynchburg, Virginia. He received the Bachelor of Science degree in Organ Performance from Liberty University in 1993, the double Master of Music degree in Organ Performance and Choral Conducting from the University of Alabama in 1996, and the Doctor of Music degree in Organ Performance and Church Music from Indiana University, Bloomington, in 2005. His teachers include David Charles Campbell, George B. Clark, the late J. Warren Hutton, Larry Smith, and Christopher Young in organ, and Sandra Willetts in conducting. In September 2007, he assumed the duties of Director of Music and Organist at Gainesville, Florida's Holy Trinity Episcopal Church, where he oversees the parish music programs and plays the three-manual, forty-nine rank Visser-Rowland organ in liturgies and concerts. Since 2014 he has served as Conductor of The Village Voices Chorus, having accompanied the group from 2010-2014. He has also served as Dean and Sub-Dean of the Gainesville Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

Previously, Dr. Lowe was Music Director and Organist at Ocala's First United Methodist Church from 2003-2007, the Artistic Director and Conductor of the Central Florida Master Choir, and Dean of the Ocala Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

Dr. Lowe has been a prizewinner in local, regional, and national competitions. In 1991 he was first place winner of the American Guild of Organists Regional Competition for Young Organists in Annapolis, Maryland, and in 1996 the second place winner of the San Marino, California Organ Competition. In 1998 and 1999, he was one of 25 young artists invited to compete in both the opening rounds of the Calgary International Organ Competition and the American Guild of Organists' National Young Artists Competition in Organ Performance, respectively. He has performed recitals in Alabama, California, the District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, New York, Ohio, Tennessee, and Virginia. His accompanying engagements have taken him to the Czech Republic, Germany, Austria, New Zealand, and Australia.

**Paul Hoffmann**, pianist, arranger, composer and conductor, studied at the Eastman School and Peabody Conservatory, was a Fulbright Scholar studying in Austria in Salzburg at the "Mozarteum," and at the Vienna Musikhochschule. Famous pianist, Rudolf Serkin, said of Hoffmann's playing, "He is a true artist." As a professor of classical piano, he taught piano performance at The Mason Gross School of the Arts at Rutgers University from 1980 to 2016. While there he served as piano department chair and conducted the Helix New Music Ensemble which he founded in 1990.

Hoffmann's main piano teachers were Leon Fleisher, famous Swiss pedagogue Cecile Genhart, Brooks Smith who was the accompanist of Yasha Heifitz, and many more. During his career, Mr. Hoffmann has performed hundreds of solo and chamber music concerts in North America, Europe and Asia. He has made over 30 recordings, has recorded live for U.S. radio stations in New York City (WNYC), and for foreign radio stations such as Radio Cologne, Radio Frankfurt, Radio France, and Voice of America.

#### Featured Poet - William Butler Yeats

W. B. Yeats was born on June 13, 1865 in Sandymount, Dublin, Ireland. He was educated in London and Dublin. His early summers were spent at the family's summer house which was located in the west of Ireland at Connaught. Yeats wrote in English and is viewed by many as one of the outstanding and most influential 20 th century poets. He was awarded the 1923 Noble Prize in Literature. His poem, The Lake Isle at Innisfree, was written in 1888, and provides a magical, serene expression of the feeling of nostalgia. Yeats passed away on January 28, 1939. We hope that you enjoy our presentation this evening of The Lake Isle. Daniel Sarkela is a rising star in the classical guitar world based in Gainesville, Florida. Originally from South Carolina, Daniel is pursuing a master's degree in Classical guitar performance and ethnomusicology from the University of Florida under the tutelage of Dr. Silviu Ciulei. Throughout the years, Daniel has performed internationally as both a soloist and ensemble member at Carnegie Hall in New York, the Paris Conservatory in France, and the Universidad central de Quito of Ecuador. He has received

numerous awards in prestigious competitions such as the Florida State Guitar Festival, Appalachian State Guitar Festival, and the University of Florida Guitar Extravaganza. Daniel is passionate about Latin American music and includes his ethnomusicological studies in his repertoire to craft a unique concert experience.
